



## Schengen visa application checklist

- > Applications must be submitted in person, together with the documents listed below.
- > For every document, you must provide the original and one photocopy.
- > All documents must be drawn up in or translated into Dutch, English, French or Spanish.

#### 1. Application

1.1 A completed and signed Schengen visa application form.  Yes  No Remarks

#### 2. Documents

2.1 A passport or other travel document.  Yes  No Remarks

**Please note**

- > Your passport or travel document must be valid for at least 3 months from the date on which you will leave the Schengen area.
- > Your passport or travel document must have at least 2 empty visa pages.
- > Your passport or travel document cannot have been issued more than 10 years ago.

> **If you are applying for a Schengen visa for a minor who will be travelling alone or with only 1 parent, please submit the following documents:**

### 3. Proof of legal residence

### 4. Photo

- 4.1 A photo that meets Dutch requirements. The photo must have been taken within the last 6 months and be a true likeness of you.  Yes  No Remarks | \_\_\_\_\_

### 5. Proof of travel

> Please note: we recommend that you make travel reservations you can cancel.

- 5.1 Travel itinerary (travel reservations in your name to and from the Schengen area. Not a ticket.)  Yes  No Remarks | \_\_\_\_\_
- 5.2 A completed proof of sponsorship and/or private accommodation form, signed by your host, i.e. the person you intend to visit. Your host must then submit this form to the Dutch municipality where they are registered.  Yes  No Remarks | \_\_\_\_\_

> If your family and/or friends are not providing you with accommodation, please submit other documents proving that you intend to visit them.

## 5.6 Proof of relationship

For example: airline tickets, previously used visas, copies of passport stamps, payment details showing that you spent time together somewhere (such as hotel reservations) statements by third parties that you are in a relationship (such as a statement from parents or friends) photos.

5.7 Documents proving that you will return to your country of residence after your trip.

> **For example:**

- An employment contract, a declaration from your employer or other documentation proving you are employed in your country of origin.
- A document proving you are in education or training in your country of origin.
- A document proving your children attend school in your country of origin.
- A document proving you have a home or other immovable property in your country of origin.
- A document proving you are a caregiver in your country of origin.

## 6. Proof of medical cover

> **An official document from your insurer proving that:**

6.1 The insurance policy has been taken out in your name.

6.2 Your insurance is valid throughout the Schengen area and for the duration of your visit.

6.3 At least €30,000 of medical costs are covered, including hospital care, emergency treatment and repatriation (including in the event of death). And including medical costs for Covid-19

Please be aware of the following:

- You will not have your passport while your visa application is being processed.
- If you do not submit the documents listed above your application may be rejected.
- The competent authorities may request additional supporting documents.
- Visa fees are not refundable, even if your application is rejected.
- Obtaining a visa does not guarantee access to the Netherlands or Schengen area
- When travelling you need to be able to show at all times:
  - Declaration of relation
  - Return ticket
  - Proof of your relation
